

Instructions for Contributors

Readers of the **it** are producers of information systems and users of information technology as well as students and scientists of the relevant fields. They expect qualified contributions about trends, methods, and practical experiences. Hence, the editors ask you to:

- Choose a title that perspicuously reflects purpose and facts of your article. The reader wants to quickly catch whether it is worthwhile reading it.
- Introduce the problem comprehensibly. Describe the topical field and the state of the art.
- Emphasize the motivation and the goals of your studies.

- Comment on the new approaches and specialties and give an outlook on further developments. Point out advantages and utilities as well as possible applications.
- In a review article, it is important to distinguish between facts, scientific evaluation, and personal opinion. Please, call attention to controversial views.
- Preferably cite primary literature, recent review articles and textbooks. The reference list should only contain entries which are actually cited in the text.

Electronical submission

Use the style files available for Microsoft Word or LaTeX. They can be downloaded from the Internet address <http://www.informatik.uni-halle.de/ti/it/>.

Send your paper to your guest editor or the editor-in-chief (paul.molitor@informatik.uni-halle.de) via electronic mail.

Your manuscript should contain

- title and abstract of your contribution in English and in German, if possible,
- keywords using the ACM Computer Classification System 1998 (<http://www.acm.org/class/1998/>),
- Short biographies and photographs (TIF- or EPS-format) of the authors,
- the final text,
- the list of literature, and
- the figures (TIF- or EPS-format) with captions.

Your electronic submission should contain

- the complete paper in either Postscript or PDF, where all figures and tables are included.
- the source files of your contribution. The figures have to be stored separately. They should be grayscaled using 300 dpi and must be available either in TIF or in EPS. The width of the lines should be at least 0.6 pt.
- the photographs of the authors must be available either in TIF or in EPS. The short biographies should not exceed 400 characters. If there are more than three authors, only a group picture of the authors can be included. Furthermore, we ask for the first names, surnames, academic titles, and the complete addresses (including the email addresses) of all authors.
- In addition we need the phone number, email-address, and the complete post address of the corresponding author for queries and for sending the galley proofs.

Length of the articles and further remarks

- The length of a „free article“ (including figures and tables) should be at most eight printed pages.
- The length of a contribution to a special issue on a particular topic should be at most six printed pages including figures and tables.
- The length of a contribution to the category „Current Main Research Fields“ and „Prized PhD Theses“ should not exceed four printed pages.
- The length of a contribution to the category „Prized PhD Theses“ should not exceed two printed pages.
- A printed page which does not contain figures and tables consists of about 5,000 characters.
- Please use subtitles up to a depth of three, e.g., 1.2.1.
- The list of literature should be alphabetically ordered using Arabic numbers for enumeration. Insert the Arabic numbers into square brackets. In the text, the citations are to be carried out by [1] or [1; 4], for example.
